Local Markets

Bishop's Waltham Country Market is held every Friday morning from 9.30am to 11.00am at the Jubilee Hall, Little Shore Lane in Bishops Waltham. They sell a wide range of home-baked goods, seasonal fruit, vegetables, plants & cut flowers, jams, preserves, honey, free-range eggs and a selection of hand-made crafts.

Bishop's Waltham Farmer's Market will be held in the High Street 10 am – 2 pm on: 7 March, 4 July, 5 September, 7 November.

Droxford. The Friday Market has been running for two years in Droxford village hall. It has all sorts of handmade goodies for sale and is open from 2-3.30pm in winter and 2-4pm in summer (after Easter).

Fareham. The Farmers' Market is held from 9am to 2pm on the first Saturday of every month, all year round in Fareham town centre.

Planning Matters

Church Meadows, St Anne's Lane

An appeal has been lodged with the Planning Inspectorate by Mrs Louise Symes against an Enforcement Notice served by the City Council regarding the siting of a caravan for residential use at Church Meadows. Both parties have agreed that the appeal shall now be dealt with by a Public Inquiry. A date has not been set yet.
